Project Highlights

7,200 SF HISTORIC HOME

This 1920's Spanish Revival estate, designed by famed architect Arthur E. Harvey, was purchased by our clients with the goal of honoring the home's history. They have since registered it as a historical landmark. The restoration of the property was a triumphant accomplishment for the owners and the project team.

In addition to restoring the home to its original quality, a major goal of the project was to make it Net Zero, where the house consumes only as much energy as it produces. Maintaining the original architectural integrity and historic value of the home, while bringing it up to and even beyond today's energyefficiency standards, presented a unique blend of challenges.
